### What is Dual Enrollment?

Dual Enrollment is a program that provides funding for students at eligible high schools that are enrolled to take approved college-level coursework for credit towards both high school and college graduation requirements.

# Dual Enrollment Step-By-Step Guide





Meet with your guidance counselor (and parent) to discuss your interest in the Dual Enrollment (DE) program at Georgia State University - Perimeter Campus. Discuss participation requirements:

- · Enrolled in an eligible high school in the state of Georgia
- · A minimum grade point average of 3.0 in core academic classes
- · Standardized test score minimum:

· SAT; minimum Math score of 26.5 and minimum Reading score of 26 ACT; minimum Math score of 21 and minimum English score of 20





Students participating in DE college courses should do so with the knowledge that the course work may be more rigorous and challenging than high school courses. Students are held to a higher degree of independent responsibility and accountability than in regular high school classes.  3. Students may be responsible for additional costs, such as course or lab fees/supplies, and/or fees charged for late or damaged textbooks.  4. Only full-time DE students are eligible to take PE at any USG institution. PE classes are not available to DE students at TCSG institutions. 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# New Information for Fall 2019-2020 Student Participation Agreement

- Starting Fall 2019 (FY 2020) students will be required to upload their Student Participation Agreement form(s) onto their Admission's checklist. In attempt to better serve students, they will have direct access to upload their SPA online via the Admission checklist. The Dual Enrollment office will no longer be accepting these forms. The Admission's checklist is available to new and returning students.
- Please note, the Summer term is a part of the FY2019 school year; however, Fall 2019 will start the FY2020 school year. Please remember that the Department of Education updates the Student Participation Agreement for the upcoming school year. The FY2020 form should be released soon.

### AP Courses vs. Dual Enrollment

#### **Advanced Placement**

- Who can enroll: Varies among high schools; some require teacher recommendations.
- Class structure: Meets everyday, EOC required, AP Exam required for college credit, Led by high school teacher.
- Cost: AP Exam Fees
- Earning Credits: A passing score on an exam is a 3 or higher, but the required minimum score for college credits differ among colleges. Many require at least a 4.

#### **Dual Enrollment**

- Who can enroll: Juniors and Seniors that are on track for graduation, a 3.0 recalculated GPA, and applicable test scores.
- Class structure: 2 3 times per week,
   No EOC required
- Cost: Funding Provided(subject to change), AP Exam not required
- Earning Credits: Students are graded on their coursework over a semester. Elite colleges are likely not to accept the credits, but many state colleges and universities do.
