Dunwoody High School is located in Dunwoody, Georgia, a northern suburb of Atlanta. DHS is a comprehensive traditional high school in the DeKalb County School District which includes grades 9 through 12. DHS has full accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and the Georgia Department of Education Accrediting Commission.

DHS has a diverse student body and faculty/staff. Currently, DHS had almost 2100 students in 2018-19 with a projected growth of 2200+ during school year 2019-20. There are 190 full-time faculty/staff members. Our faculty is fully certified with most holding a master's degree or higher.

We operate on a two-semester system and use a 4x4 block schedule. Classes meet for 90 minutes each day, five days per week, for 18 weeks totaling 135 contact hours per course. This gives students the opportunity to earn 32 credits, opposed to the traditional 28. Students at DHS can earn college credit via AP classes and dual enrollment.

With an amazing student body, extraordinary faculty & staff and a supportive community, our students are poised to be lifelong learners and productive members of an increasingly diverse society.
