

The Georgia Milestones End of Course Assessments will be administered in person at Dunwoody High School

December 8 - 18, 2020 at 8:00 AM each day

- DCSD will provide bus transportation to and from Dunwoody High School for students taking End of Course Assessments. Transportation WILL NOT be provided for make-up days.
- All individuals entering DHS are required to wear a mask/face covering for the entire time present in the building.
- There will not be more than 15 students assigned to a testing room. Students will be seated with at least six feet between them.
- Students should bring their DCSD issued Chromebook for testing. If they do not have one, we will provide a device.
- All water fountains are closed; Students may bring bottled water.
- Students not testing during the December Testing window will receive an "Incomplete" on their report card until the EOC Assessment requirement is satisfied. Students will be afforded a make-up opportunity as identified in the <u>DCSD Assessment Calendar</u> as EOC Mid-Month Assessments.
- ** Dunwoody High School and The DeKalb County School District will follow all Georgia Health Department and the Center for Disease Control Health and Safety Guidelines as related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Frequently Asked Questions

Will the EOC's take place inside DHS, or virtually?	All EOC Assessments are in person. The Georgia Department of Education has not made provisions for a virtual test environment for the End of Course (EOC) Assessment administrations due to test security protocols.			
What is the protocol for students who are uncomfortable/not willing to take the EOC?	Families not comfortable with sending their students into the building for testing have the right to keep their students home. DCSD has always had protocols for students who miss EOC Assessments. Provision will be made for those students to make-up tests at a later date during Spring Semester.

Students will be absent from other classes while testing. How is this addressed?	Testing is a school activity; therefore, students will be considered present their attendance will reflect their presence.			
What details can you provide about what testing might look like? Spacing, student numbers, etc.	There will not be more than 15 students assigned to a testing room. Students will be seated with at least six feet between them.			
What is the weight of the EOC?	Superintendent Woods recommended to the State Board of Education (SBOE) that the Georgia Milestones End-of-Course (EOC) percentage weight to be included in a student's final grade be reduced from 20% to .01% for the 2020-2021 school year. The SBOE did not approve this recommendation and proposed reducing the EOC percentage weight from 20% to 10%. This proposal was posted for public comment. No decision has been made as of 11/16/2020.			
How long will testing take? What time should I pick up my child after testing?	Test times vary by content area. See the tentative testing administration schedule on the next page.
