

## PSAT/NMSQT Test Day Checklist

There are only a few things you really need to bring on PSAT/NMSQT day and many things you'll be better off leaving at home – or at least in your locker.

### What to Bring

- Two No. 2 pencils with erasers
- An approved calculator, see the PSAT/NMSQT Student Guide (available in DHS counseling office)
- For non-Dunwoody High School students - Valid school or government issued photo ID. If unavailable, students can use a notarized College Board Student ID Form. Please report to the Media Center upon arrival.

### What NOT to Bring

- Any devices, including smart-watches, that can be used to record, transmit, receive or play back audio, photographic, text, or video content
- Protractors, compasses, rulers
- Highlighters, colored pens, colored pencils
- Pamphlets or papers of any kind
- Dictionaries or other books — there are no exceptions, even if English is not your first language
- Food and drinks — including bottled water — unless approved by the College Board's Services for Students with Disabilities
- You may find a complete list of prohibited items in the PSAT/NMSQT Student Guide.

### During the Test

These are the only items allowed on your desk in the testing session: a test book, an answer sheet, #2 pencils with erasers, and an approved calculator (only during one of the math sections).

Please leave ALL Electronic Devices and book bags in your locker. We are serious about providing a secure, quiet environment, therefore prohibited devices, which include cellphones, tablets, and MP3 players, smart watches, etc. may not be brought into the testing rooms.

**Important:** If you use a cell phone or if it makes a noise, even during breaks, you will be dismissed immediately. Your phone may also be confiscated and inspected.
