



PSAT/NMSQT Test Day Checklist

When: Tuesday, January 26th, 9:00 AM

The PSAT standard administration takes about three hours after the demographic information is completed; total time could be up to 4 hours.

What to Bring

- Face covering or mask for the entire test administration
- Two No. 2 pencils with erasers
- Approved calculator (see sat.org/calculators or PSAT/NMSQT Student Guide)

What NOT to Bring

- Electronic devices, including smart-watches, that can be used to record, transmit, receive or play back audio, photographic, text, or video content
- Protractors, compasses, rulers
- Highlighters, colored pens, colored pencils
- Pamphlets or papers of any kind
- Dictionaries or other books — there are no exceptions, even if English is not your first language
- Food and drinks — including bottled water — unless approved by the College Board's Services for Students with Disabilities

During the Test

- Prohibited devices must not be brought into the testing rooms; these include but not limited to cellphones, tablets, smart watches, AirPods, etc.
- Cell phones may not be used, seen, or heard while in the school (even during breaks). Student will be dismissed from testing immediately and disciplinary consequences may be assigned.
- *Students showing signs of fever, cough, runny nose, chills, or any other cold-like symptoms, on test day should not participate in this administration.*
