PSAT/NMSQT Test Day Checklist

There are only a few things you really need to bring on test day and a lot of things you'll be better off leaving at home – or at least in your locker.

What to Bring

- □ Two No. 2 pencils with erasers
- An approved calculator, see the PSAT/NMSQT Student Guide (available in DHS counseling office)
- For non-Dunwoody High School students Valid school or government issued photo ID. If unavailable, students can use a notarized College Board Student ID Form.

What NOT to Bring

- Any devices, including smart-watches, that can be used to record, transmit, receive or play back audio, photographic, text, or video content
- Protractors, compasses, rulers
- Highlighters, colored pens, colored pencils
- Pamphlets or papers of any kind
- Dictionaries or other books there are no exceptions, even if English is not your first language
- Food and drinks including bottled water unless approved by the College Board's Services for Students with Disabilities.
- Ms. L. Harris, your school testing administrator can share a complete list of prohibited devices — you may also find it in the Official Student Guide.

During the Test

You will be allowed to have only these items on your desk: A test book, an answer sheet, #2 pencils with erasers, and an approved calculator — only during one of the math sections.

Please leave ALL Electronic Devices in your locker. We are serious about providing a secure, quiet environment, therefore prohibited devices, which include cellphones, tablets, and MP3 players, smart watches, etc. must not be brought into the testing rooms.

Important: You will be dismissed immediately and your scores will be canceled if you use your phone or if it makes a noise — even during breaks. Your phone may also be confiscated and inspected.
