Each year the Georgia Phi Chapter sponsors a \$1,000.00 scholarship to be paid to an individual interested in becoming a teacher or other education-related professional. The scholarship is open to interested male and female students who are graduating from high school in May/June 2022 or any college or university student currently enrolled in a full-time course of study.

Selection of the recipient will be based on the three following categories: successful academic achievement, desire to teach or to enter the educational profession in some other capacity, and financial need.

To apply for this scholarship, we ask that you do the following:

- 1) Complete the [Application Form](#), including the student essay portion.
- 2) Submit an electronic copy of your current high school or college transcript. If you must send a hard copy of your transcript, please contact the committee for the appropriate mailing address.
- 3) Provide recommendations from an academic teacher and a community, church, or school sponsor of your extracurricular activities. We ask that all recommendations be sent directly to the scholarship committee and not be handled by the student. You may use the “[Letter to Teachers and Sponsors](#)” attached to your informational email to provide background about our organization, the scholarship, and relevant contact information.

Read each part of the application carefully and answer all questions thoroughly. Please complete the application electronically and return your completed application and copy of your transcript to the contact listed below by April 1, 2023. The Scholarship winner will be determined by June 1, 2023. All applications, recommendations, transcripts, and questions should be sent to:
