Dunwoody High School Cheerleading By Laws

THE PURPOSE:

- to develop the individual potential of each member of mutually giving and accepting leadership duties, responsibilities, and criticism
- to set a good example and proper conduct, sportsmanship, and leadership for the student body by abiding with ALL school rules and fostering general student cooperation in all school policies
- to be a loyal representative of the school and community by engaging in all activities with prideful respect and exemplification of the purpose for which our school and community exist
- to support all athletic teams by inspiring spontaneous school pride and spirit

TRYOUTS:

Qualification:

- each cheerleader must be eligible to participate by passing the required academic classes
- each cheerleader must present all paperwork signed by the parent/legal guardian agreeing to abide by all DHS tryout rules and to accept the decision of the judges and coaches as final
- tryouts are closed to all persons except judges, contestants, administrators, and coaches
- all persons trying out must be prepared to accept full financial responsibility of all cheerleading expenses or will sit out or be removed from the squad
- · the decision of the coaches is final and the scores are confidential
- cheerleaders must show proof of a current, valid physical exam and to present a waiver of insurance prior to practice and tryouts.
 You will not be allowed to participate in any cheerleading activity without these documents.
- each cheerleader must attend all practice, summer camp, summer practices, summer and school year activities and participate in all fundraising activities

Selection:

- coaches will evaluate each participant on: appearance, attitude, GPA, motions, stunting, , dance, tumbling, need for flyer/base, teacher and administrator evaluation
- each participant will wear a number on their shirt that will coordinate with the number on the ballot
- a ballot will be prepared with the expected qualifications and notes will be taken throughout each day's practice and evaluation
- all ballots will be kept for one calendar year

ACADEMIC AND BEHAVIORAL REQUIREMENTS:

each cheerleader is expected to always comply with DHS rules and regulations and GHSA rules. Respect for team members, coach, players, and players of other teams is expected at all times, in and out of season. Athletics and academics go hand in hand. Each cheerleader is expected to maintain passing grades in all classes throughout the school year. Failure to comply with either the behavioral or academic requirements as per the coach could result in sitting out a game to removal from the squad. All consequences are given at the discretion of the coach throughout the season and while at camp or other functions.

CODE OF CONDUCT:

- each member of the cheerleading squad shall be aware of and exemplify the highest standards of conduct in the classroom, on campus, in the community and for their fellow students at all times
- no member of the cheerleading squad shall attract undesirable attention or behave in an undignified manner at any time
- each member's attitude shall be one of willingness to give up personal desires for the good of the squad at all times
- · no member will show public display of affection while in uniform
- · smoking, drinking, and or drug use are grounds for immediate suspension or dismissal from the team

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- all cheerleaders are <u>required</u> to attend all games, pre-games, summer camp practices, camp, and any other summer or school year activity
- all cheerleaders are required to cheer in all pre and post games. If a cheerleader misses a game the consequence will come at the
 discretion of the coach. Missing a game and/or practice could result in sitting out a game to removal from the squad.
- J.V. and Varsity cheerleaders are required to come to and participate in some of each others games; ex. Senior Night, Homecoming, etc
- all members must be present and on time for all practices, games, pre-games, and any other activities. An absence could result in sitting out a game to removal from the squad as per the discretion of the coach
- · cheerleaders are not allowed to stunt if the coach is not present
- if the coach deems that a cheerleader is unprepared to perform or attitude is undeserving the coach may deny the cheerleader cheering privileges for that game and/or pep rally or event. The cheerleader is still expected to attend the event and sit next to the coach.
- a cheerleader must be present at school to participate in practice and the day of a game or event in order to cheer that night. The
 parent and/or the cheerleader must contact the coach that day if absent. The coach may refuse to allow a team member to cheer
 based on her absence.
- the entire squad must be ready to cheer 2 minutes prior to the beginning of a game or after a half-time.
- all cheerleaders must go to and from each event by bus
- cheerleaders must have some means of transportation home after an event within 15 minutes of arriving at school
- no cell phones allowed during practice and/or games
- the coach is not responsible in any way for any items lost during practice or any other event during the season.
- payment must be made on the date requested or the parent must be in communication with the coach as to why the payment has not been made
- each member will be required to maintain 'good condition' and cleanliness of their uniform on a weekly basis; each member and/or
 parent will be required to have uniforms cleaned and mended for end of the season return of the uniform
- demerit system: a coach may use this system and will discuss how points are accrued and possible consequences during a parent meeting
